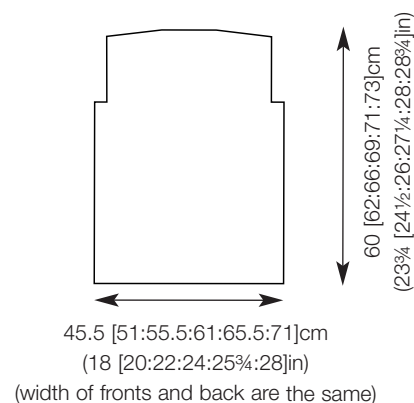

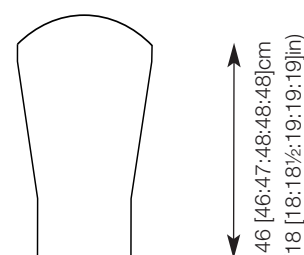
## MATERIALS

F215 Moonstone shade 202 10 11 13 15 16 17 50g balls

Also suitable for Cotton Rich Aran. Amounts may vary.

The yarn amounts are based on average requirements when specified tension and yarn is used.

You will also need 1 Pair of 5mm (UK6 – USA8) Knitting Needles and 1 Pair of 4mm (UK8 – USA6) Knitting Needles.



## TENSION

33 sts and 60 rows to 20cm, (8in) over lace pattern on 5mm needles and 18 sts and 24 rows to 10cm, (4in) over stocking stitch on 5mm needles or the size required to give correct tension. Check your tension - if less stitches use a thinner needle, if more use a thicker needle.

**IT IS ESSENTIAL TO WORK TO THE STATED TENSION TO ENSURE SUCCESS.**

## ABBREVIATIONS

**beg** beginning, **cm** centimetres, **cont** continue,  **foll** following, **g** grammes, **in** inch(es), **inc** increase(ing), **k** knit, **mm** millimetres, **p** purl, **patt** pattern, **rem** remain(ing), **rep** repeat, **rs** right side, **s1** slip 1 stitch knitways, **st(s)** stitch(es), **tog** together, **ws** wrong side, **yfwd** yarn forward, **yrn** yarn round needle.

## Circle the size you wish to make

## BACK

Using 4mm needles and thumb method cast on 82 [92:100:110:118:128] sts.

**1st Row.** Knit.

This row will now be referred to as **g-st** (garter stitch).

Work 3 rows more in g-st.

Change to 5mm needles and proceed as follows:-

**1st Row.** Knit.

**2nd Row.** Purl.

These 2 rows will now be referred to as **st-st** (stocking stitch).

Working in st-st (throughout) cont until back measures 41 [41:43:45:46:47]cm, (16 [16:17:17<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub>:18:18<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>]in), ending with a ws row.

**Shape Armholes**

Cast off 8 [8:8:12:12:12] sts

at beg of next 2 rows.

66 [76:84:86:94:104] sts.

Cont without shaping until armholes measure 19 [21:23:24:25:26]cm, (7<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> [8<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>:9:9<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>:9<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub>:10<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>]in), ending with a ws row.

**Shape Shoulders**

Cast off 11 [13:15:14:16:19]

sts at beg of next 2 rows.

44 [50:54:58:62:66] sts.

Cast off 11 [13:15:15:17:19] sts at beg of next 2 rows.

22 [24:24:28:28:28] sts.

Cast off rem 22 [24:24:28:28:28] sts.

## LEFT FRONT

Using 5mm needles and thumb method cast on 76 [84:92:100:108:116] sts.

**1st Row.** S1, yfwd, yrn, p2tog, k1, \* k1, yfwd, yrn, p2tog, k1, rep from \* to end.

1st row sets lace patt.

Working in lace patt as set (throughout) cont until left front measures 41 [41:43:45:46:47]cm, (16 [16:17:17<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub>:18:18<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>]in), ending with a ws row.

## Shape Armhole

**Next Row.** Cast off 8 [8:8:12:12:12] sts in patt, patt to end. 68 [76:84:88:96:104] sts.

Cont without shaping until armhole measures 19 [21:23:24:25:26]cm, (7<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> [8<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>:9:9<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>:9<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub>:10<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>]in), ending with a ws row.

## Shape Shoulder

**Next Row.** Cast off 8 [12:12:12:16:16] sts in patt, patt to end. 60 [64:72:76:80:88] sts.

**Next Row.** Patt.

**Next Row.** Cast off 12 [12:16:16:16:20] sts in patt, patt to end.

48 [52:56:60:64:68] sts.

**Next Row.** Patt.

Cast off rem 48 [52:56:60:64:68] sts in patt.

## RIGHT FRONT

Using 5mm needles and thumb method cast on 76 [84:92:100:108:116] sts. Working in lace patt as set for Left Front (throughout) cont until right front measures 41 [41:43:45:46:47]cm, (16 [16:17:17<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub>:18:18<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>]in), ending with a rs row.

## Shape Armhole

**Next Row.** Cast off 8 [8:8:12:12:12] sts in patt, patt to end. 68 [76:84:88:96:104] sts. Cont without shaping until armhole measures 19 [21:23:24:25:26]cm, (7<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> [8<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>:9:9<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>:9<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub>:10<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>]in), ending with a rs row.

## Shape Shoulder

**Next Row.** Cast off 8 [12:12:12:16:16] sts in patt, patt to end.

60 [64:72:76:80:88] sts.

**Next Row.** Patt.

**Next Row.** Cast off 12 [12:16:16:16:20] sts in patt, patt to end.

48 [52:56:60:64:68] sts.

**Next Row.** Patt.

Cast off rem 48 [52:56:60:64:68] sts in patt.

## SLEEVES

### (Both alike)

Using 4mm needles and thumb method cast on 38 [40:42:44:46:46] sts.

Work 4 rows in g-st.

Change to 5mm needles and working in st-st (throughout) cont until sleeve measures 15 [15:16:16:16:16]cm, (6 [6:6<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>:6<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>:6<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>:6<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>]in), ending with a ws row.

Inc 1 st at each end of next and every foll 6th [6th:4th:4th:4th:4th] row to 48 [58:54:62:70:76] sts.

Inc 1 st at each end of every foll 8th [8th:6th:6th:6th:6th] row to 58 [62:68:72:76:78] sts.

Cont without shaping until sleeve measures 46 [46:47:48:48:48]cm, (18 [18:18<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>:19:19:19]in), or length required, ending with a ws row.

## Shape Sleeve Top

Place markers at each end of last row.

Work 10 [10:10:16:16:16] rows more.

Cast off 3 [3:2:3:2:2] sts at beg of next 10 [12:4:10:4:2]

rows. 28 [26:60:42:68:74] sts.  
 Cast off 3 [4:3:3:3:3] sts at  
 beg of next 6 [4:16:10:18:20]  
 rows. 10 [10:12:12:14:14] sts.  
 Cast off rem 10 [10:12:12:  
 14:14] sts.

## TO MAKE UP

Join shoulder seams. Join  
 sleeve seams to markers. Sew  
 remainder of sleeve seam to  
 cast off stitches at armholes.  
 Sew in sleeves. Join side

seams. Pin out garment to  
 the measurement given.  
 Cover with damp cloths and  
 leave until dry. See ball band  
 for washing and further care  
 instructions.
